2021 SCHOLARSHIP RECIPIENTS

After much deliberation on the part of the Pi Gamma Mu Awards Committee, the committee's chairperson, Dr. Clara Small, recommended 6 applicants to the Board of Trustees. The Trustees awarded scholarships to the following lifetime members of Pi Gamma Mu: Kristen Renee Moran, Laura Guida, Branson Michael Freeman, Canei Mone't Hines, James Langford, and Shantecia Lynette Johnson.

Kristen Renee Moran was awarded a \$2,000 Pi Gamma Mu scholarship. She was inducted into Pi Gamma Mu during her undergraduate studies at Wilmington University. In 2019, Moran received her Bachelor's degree in Behavioral Sciences, along with certificates in Conflict Resolution and Child Advocacy Studies. She credits her close relationship with her brother, Brian, for influencing her career path and passions in assisting families to operate at their full potentials. Since graduating, Moran is continuing her education, working toward a Master's degree in Applied Family Science from Wilmington University. With this degree, she plans to become a Certified Family Life Educator to provide educational resources for families within her community. Throughout her academic career, she has mentored freshman students navigating their transitions to college life through her university's Student Success Center. She now works for EPIC, a Delaware nonprofit organization promoting opportunities for independence and community integration for adults with intellectual disabilities. In her personal time, Moran enjoys spending time with her nieces, making jewelry, cooking, writing music, and exploring other creative outlets. Regarding her membership with Pi Gamma Mu, she is "truly appreciative of the personal connections, funding, and publishing opportunities made available to [her]." 
Branson Michael Freeman was awarded a Pi Gamma Mu

Shantecia Lynette Johnson received the Dan Quigley Scholarship of \$1,000. The International Board of Trustees funded this scholarship to memorialize Atty. Dan Quigley, Pi Gamma Mu's late legal counsel. This scholarship is awarded specifically to students in their first year of law school. Johnson attended undergrad at Southern University A&M College and was inducted into the Southern University Chapter in 2017 where Professor Blanche Smith was the faculty advisor. She earned a Bachelor's degree in Political Science. Johnson enjoys researching and learning about new and passed laws. In the future, she hopes to help falsely accused victims become free of the system. She will be receiving a dual MPA/JD degree at Southern University Law Center. Her long-term goal is to become a criminal, civil and juvenile defense attorney. After approximately ten years serving the field, she plans to run for a judge seat at the 19th JDC in Baton Rouge, La. When asked about his membership in Pi Gamma Mu, Johnson said, "My membership in Pi Gamma Mu has impacted me immensely, especially in providing me with opportunities such as this to earn scholarships that have helped towards lowering my financial burden in achieving my career dreams and obtaining a legal education." 2021 VIRTUAL CONVENTION A RESOUNDING SUCCESS

In light of ongoing developments with COVID-19, Pi Gamma Mu decided to move its 2021 Triennial International Convention, "Social Scientists Leading the Way", to a fully online experience that took place on November 3-6 of 2021. By all accounts, the Convention was a resounding success!

The pivot to a virtual convention made for an exciting, affordable, and safe event available to more attendees than ever before. It is the first virtual convention attempted by the organization, but one that pleased everyone during this COVID period. Pi Gamma Mu members enjoyed the opportunity to present papers and posters, hear notable speakers, and meet other honor students from colleges and universities around the globe. With the continuing issues with the COVID pandemic, and decreasing revenue available for student travel, this year's virtual convention was a crowd-pleaser. Suzanne Rupp, Executive Director of the organization, reports that attendance was higher than ever. "The online format of the Convention not only provided for the safety demanded by the pandemic, but it also provided an affordable way for more members to attend than ever before. The online event platform also houses the video presentations created by the student research paper presenters and the poster presenters, giving the presenters and attendees even more opportunities to network. Registered convention attendees have access to view the videos through February 6, 2022. We have seen ongoing interaction among convention attendees on the platform even a month after the conclusion of the event, which indicates that attendees are still enjoying the online Convention."

The highlight of any Pi Gamma Mu Convention is the student research paper presentations and this year was no different with seventeen (17) students presenting their research. Even more students presented their research during the research poster session which included seven (7) presenters. Chapters also had time to share their achievements during the chapter poster session which included nine (9) additional presentations.

At this year's convention, Pi Gamma Mu recognized historical and current Pi Gamma Mu members who have demonstrated excellence in their field. We were proud to present impressive speakers again this year. Pi Gamma Mu has an illustrious history of members who include such famous leaders as Admiral Richard E. Byrd and President Lyndon B. Johnson. One such member is Dr. Judith Rodin who was selected to receive our Outstanding Alumni Award at this year's 2021 Pi Gamma Mu Virtual Convention. Dr. Rodin, a Pi Gamma Mu member since her undergraduate days at the University of Pennsylvania, has been recognized by Forbes Magazine as one of the world's most powerful and influential women. Over her 22 years at Yale University, she held various professional and academic positions as Associate Professor, Chair of the Department of Psychology, Dean of the Graduate School of Arts and Sciences, and Provost of the university. Rodin was appointed president of the University of Pennsylvania in 1994 and became the first female president of an Ivy League institution and the first graduate of the university to take on its highest leadership role. From 2005 to 2017 she served as President of the Rockefeller Foundation and in her philanthropic role authored, "The Resilience Dividend," which has become a strategic guide for leaders around the world.

United States Senator Chuck Grassley (IA) also joined us for a keynote message to the Convention participants. Senator Grassley completed his Political Science undergraduate degree from the University of Northern Iowa and is a lifetime member of Pi Gamma Mu. He has been instrumental in American policymaking as an American politician.

Other speakers included Congresswoman Diane DeGette, a U.S. Representative serving Colorado's 1st Congressional District who has been a leading proponent and expert on cutting-edge scientific research, including the use of human embryonic stem cells. She has been instrumental in expanding the State Children's Health Insurance Program (SCHIP), a program of health insurance for low-income children, and assisted President Obama in drafting the Affordable Care Act. DeGette is best known for advocating the 21st Century Cures Act, which has modernized research in the nation's medical system.

Another feature of the Convention was the popular Leadership Development Program, a series started at the last convention in Kansas City, MO, which focuses on numerous concepts in leadership. Lectures included discussions about leadership in academia, leadership in special circumstances, and leadership in nonprofit organizations. The program also offered a series of workshops helping students to better understand their own leadership skills, the characteristics of strong and weak leadership, and the importance of team collaboration. Students who attended all of the workshops, lectures, and complete all of the leadership program pieces will receive a certificate of completion from Pi Gamma Mu for their resume.

2021 TOP STUDENT PAPERS

Pi Gamma Mu held its 2021 Triennial Convention online due to the ongoing Covid-19 pandemic. The convention was held on November 3-6, 2021. The convention had most of the features of in-person triennial conventions, with some extra features, and was much more affordable. Student members were encouraged to submit completed social science research papers for presentation consideration at the 2021 Convention. All accepted papers were ranked by the Committee of Readers. Dr. Charles Hartwig serves as Chair of the Committee of Readers and is the Chancellor of the South/Southwest Region on the Pi Gamma Mu Board of Trustees.

2021 LEADERSHIP DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM ENJOYS SUCCESS

After postponing last year's convention due to COVID-19, the Pi Gamma Mu 2021 Virtual Triennial International Convention took place November 3-6, 2021, with the theme "Social Scientists Leading the Way." For the second time in convention history, participants could attend a Leadership Development program for a modest fee. Pi Gamma Mu board of trustee member, Allison G. S. Knox, directed the seven-hour event. Professor Knox teaches at the American Military University.

Throughout the program, participants learned about leadership in a variety of different contexts including academia, stressful environments, non-profit organizations, public policy, and in the United States Marine Corps. The virtual event included webinars, lectures, and a unique online experience with **Laura Shaw**, teacher-in-residence at the National Museum of the Marine Corps in Triangle, Virginia. LIFETIME MEMBER RUNS FOR LOCAL OFFICE IN THE PHILIPPINES

Joebert Flores Padata Jr., lifetime member of Pi Gamma Mu, is running for a position on the City Council in his home city of BOGO in the Province of Cebu, Philippines. The election will be held on May 9, 2022. If elected, Padata ("Sir Bert" as he is known in political circles which highlights the fact that he is a teacher) will be part of the legislative body that shall enact ordinances, approve resolutions, and appropriate funds for the general welfare of the city. Padata's platform includes boosting tourism in rural areas, increasing IT utilization with enhanced data security in government transactions, teaching reproductive health and responsible parenthood for the youth, and upholding transparency and trust in resource allocation and public spending.

Padata joined Pi Gamma Mu International Honor Society in Society Social Sciences via the Philippines Alpha Chapter located at the University of the Philippines. He was inducted during the chapter's first-ever virtual induction ceremony. The ceremony was held on August 31, 2020. The guest speaker was, Her Excellency, Atty. Maria Leonor Gerona Robredo, the 14th Vice President of the Philippines.

Padata participated in the 2021 Pi Gamma Mu Triennial International Convention, "Social Scientists Leading the Way" on November 3-6, 2021. The Convention was held online and despite a twelve-hour time zone difference and a convention schedule based on business hours in the United States, Padata attended the middle-of-the-night sessions throughout the convention, including the 2021 Leadership Development Program which focused on numerous concepts in leadership. Lectures included discussions about leadership in academia, leadership in special circumstances, and leadership in nonprofit organizations. The program also offered a series of workshops helping students to better understand their own leadership skills, the characteristics of strong and weak leadership, and the importance of team collaboration.

Padata is currently a member of the Teaching Faculty at Cebu Normal University in the Philippines. He earned a Bachelor of Arts in Psychology from the University of the Philippines Cebu in 2015 and a Master of Education in Social Studies from the University of the Philippines Professional Schools – Cebu in 2020 where he graduated with distinction.

- · Created care packages for the homeless in New York City.
- · Volunteered at the Philadelphia Animal Welfare Society.




INTERNATIONAL BOARD OF TRUSTEES ANNUAL MEETING

This is at least the second period in its history that the Board of Trustees canceled in-person meetings due to extreme circumstances. During World War II, the Trustees decided to handle their business by mail in order to leave as many resources as possible for the war effort.

Immediate Past President of the Board of Trustees, **Larry Heck**, produced a video for the annual meeting in which he shared some of the history of the Presidential Gavel and presented the Gavel to new President of the Board of Trustees, Susan Kinsella. Because the meeting was held virtually due to the pandemic, President Heck made the video and shipped the Gavel to President Kinsella in advance of the meeting so that she could open the meeting with a bang of the Gavel, a long-standing Pi Gamma Mu Tradition. The wooden gavel is wrapped with a brass band which is engraved with "Pi Gamma Mu" and the strike block is carved with the same, "Pi Gamma Mu".

As the Society started a new Triennial Period, a new President was sworn in. Dr. Susan Kinsella, Dean at Saint Leo University in Florida, became Pi Gamma Mu's 16th President.

- 6. **Social Service** the primary purpose of science is to know and to enable us to do. What we know we want to put to work for the benefit of humanity.
- 7. **Sacrifice** we are engaged in the greatest and finest of all the arts, the building of human society. Without giving freely, fully, and sacrificially of means, time, talent, energy and passion, all our other ideals will fall short and the contributions we hope to bring will never come.

SYMBOLS OF PI GAMMA MU

The motto of the Society is the epigram of the Master Teacher, "Ye shall know the truth and the truth shall make you free."

The society's **key** has a wreath at the bottom to suggest that social science is the outgrowth and fulfillment of natural science. The running figure is reminiscent of the ancient Greek torch race and symbolizes humanity bringing knowledge to the solution of its own problems and passing on the light from generation to generation.

The colors are blue and white - for truth and light.

The official **flower** is the blue and white cineraria.
